

Introduction

The bluePRINT Link® module works with the bluePRINT Control System to provide access to a broad range of vehicle data, including speed and real-time status of brakes, doors, transmission, lighting and door locks. Incorporating bluePRINT Link into the vehicle can greatly reduce or even eliminate the need to modify or splice into the vehicle's wiring while providing a broader range of vehicle signal data to the upfit technician.

bluePRINT Link configuration is done using SoundOff Central $^{\text{TM}}$ or bluePRINT 3 programming software.

№ WARNING

- · bluePRINT Link installation requires interfacing with the vehicle CANBUS system. All connections should be double-checked and secured prior to completing installation.
- Refer to vehicle manufacturer's instructions for connection to the CANBUS.
- DO NOT install this product or route any wires in the Air Bag Deployment Zone. Refer to vehicle Owner's Manual or Upfit Guide for deployment zones.
- Do NOT use system to disconnect headlights, brake lights or other safety equipment.



Hardware Requirements

In order to use the bluePRINT Link Module, two connection harnesses are required.

The first harness is the bluePRINT Link Data Harness that connects between the bluePRINT Link® module and the bluePRINT Central Controller or bluePRINT 500 Series Control System:

Service Part Number bluePRINT Link Data Harness ENGLNDH001

The second required harness is the bluePRINT Link Vehicle Harness. This harness is vehicle specific and may vary. When connecting the vehicle harness, please follow the specific directions included with the vehicle harness.

Registering your bluePRINT Link Module online extends the warranty from 1 year of ship date to a total of 3 years from the ship date

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
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Installation Instructions

- 1. Follow the bluePRINT Link Vehicle Harness instructions for vehicle connection.
- 2. Connect the vehicle harness to the bluePRINT Link Module using the 6-position connector (white).
- 3. Connect the bluePRINT Link Data Harness to the bluePRINT Link Module using the 4-pin connector (black).
- 4. Connect the bluePRINT Link Data harness to the bluePRINT Control Panel Data Bus. This connection is an RJ-45 socket. On the Central Controller, it is labeled CP. On the 500 Series Control System it is labeled CN11. This may require a parallel RJ-45 splitter, available from SoundOff Signal.
- 5. Secure the bluePRINT Link module and any excess wiring. Use the included zip-ties or installer-provided screws or Scotch-Lock fastener tape.
- 6. Post installation testing and basic troubleshooting is detailed on the next page.





Module Initial Power-Up & Post Installation Testing

When the bluePRINT Link module is first plugged in, it attempts to acquire the vehicles' VIN so it can accurately interpret vehicle data on the CAN network. The key must be in the run position for CAN network traffic to be present (engine off is OK.)

Ensure the ignition is on and the CAN bus is awake. With most vehicles, the CAN bus will go to sleep (stop sending data) if the engine is off and there is no state change in any of the CAN parameters after several minutes. The amount of time before the CAN bus goes to sleep varies by vehicle manufacturer. If the bluePRINT Link module is unresponsive, ensure the CAN bus is awake by tapping the brake pedal or cycling the ignition off then on.

The bluePRINT Link module has a configuration that will show the state of certain vehicle parameters. These parameters are mapped to LEDs 1-8 on the bluePRINT Link module. LEDs 9 and 10 are not used. Parameters are mapped to the LEDs as indicated in the chart below

LED #	Function	
1	Service Brake	
2	Driver Front Door	
3	Passenger Front Door	
4	Park	
5	Reverse	
6	Drive	
7	Low Beam	
8	High Beam	
9	Not Used	
10	Not Used	

EXAMPLE: Press the service brake, LED1 will go on, release the service brake, LED1 will go off. Open the driver's front door, LED2 will go on, close the door, LED2 will go off. If these and the remaining parameters are responding, the bluePRINT Link module is able to decode the CAN parameters for the associated vehicle.

Data Link Sticker

The bluePRINT Link Module comes with a warning sticker for user application. This sticker reads as follows:


This vehicle is equipped With a DATA LINK "T" harness. Only disconnect for scan tool Use if unable to communicate Reconnect when diagnostics Are completed

It is the user's responsibility to apply this sticker to the vehicle, but can also be omitted at their discretion.

bluePRINT Link Firmware Updates

bluePRINT Link firmware is updated frequently to provide support for newer vehicle chassis. We recommend updating firmware any time there is a vehicle connectivity problem (as described in the table to the left).

Firmware must be updated directly to the bluePRINT Link module through the RJ9 programming port using specific software. Firmware updates cannot be done using bluePRINT or SoundOff Central Programming Software. In addition, a proprietary programming cable is required. This cable can be purchased from Intermotive dealers, or through SoundOff Signal. The part number for the programming kit is A-IPU. Troubleshooting

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


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Vehicle Installation Instructions

- 1. Locate the vehicle's OBD-II / J1962 Connector. This is typically under the driver side dashboard.
- 2. Remove any hardware securing the OBD-II / J1962 Connector.
- 3. Connect the female end of the bluePRINT Link Vehicle Harness to the OBD-II / J1962 Connector.
- 4. Loop a zip tie around both connectors and pull snug to prevent the connectors from vibrating loose.
- 5. Secure the male end of the bluePRINT Link Vehicle Harness in the original mounting place.
- 6. Connect the vehicle harness to the bluePRINT Link Module using the 6 position connector (white).
- Follow the remaining instructions for the bluePRINT Link Module, starting from step 3. When securing all wiring, pay special attention to the vehicle harness circuit board.



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


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Data Harness Installation Instructions

- Connect the bluePRINT Link Data Harness to the bluePRINT Link Module using the 4 pin connector (black).
- Route the data cable to the Central Controller or 500 Series Control System. Note: The data harness may require the use of a parallel splitter (not included) when more than one device utilize the Control Panel Data port on either the Central Controller or CN11 on the 500 Series Control Panel.
- 3. Connect the bluePRINT Link Data harness to the bluePRINT Control Panel Data Bus. This connection is an RJ-45 socket. On the Central Controller, it is labeled CP. On the 500 Series Control System it is labeled CN11. Note: Connections can be made at either the port at the system controller, or the port at the control panel itself. When available, certain control panels have two RJ-45 data ports. bluePRINT Link can be directly connected to either one of these, as they are internally parallel.
- 4. Follow the remaining instructions for the bluePRINT Link Module, starting from step 4.



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
